

Reconciliation 2020 - Year 3 Students

On Tuesday, February 24th families from St Francis Xavier (SFX), Holy Trinity (HT) and Our Lady Help of Christians (OLHC) gathered at SFX Church to begin preparations for the Sacrament of Reconciliation for our Year 3 students, led by our Year 3 Sacramental team from our 3 schools and 2 Parishes.

Fr Michael enlightened us with the historical, Christian perspective of Reconciliation and explained how this year the Parishes of Montmorency and Eltham will experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation as a 'Communal Rite of Forgiveness'.

Emphasis was placed, that as we prepare our children for Reconciliation it is important we do so in partnership as a '**Parent Initiated, School Supported and Parish Based Program**'.

Our children will receive a resource, '*Becoming Catholic Reconciliation-A practical guide for families*' By *Kathy Horan*. (This will be given out in class, when the books arrive).

The aim of this book is to assist parents in helping to prepare their child at home, as well as building their own faith formation, in a partnership with conversations that will also be taking place at school. The idea is that this text will be the catalyst to open up the 'God talk' at home... 'What is the Sacrament of Reconciliation? How do we say sorry? How do we forgive someone when they have hurt us?' As well as providing scripture and an opportunity for family activities and reflection.

The 2020 Reconciliation celebrations will be held on the following weeknight dates at 7:00pm in either the St Francis Xavier or Our Lady Help of Christians Parish Church:

- * Tuesday 10th March (SFX) at 7pm
- * Thursday 12th March (OLHC) at 7pm
- * Thursday 19th March (SFX) at 7pm

Parishioners are more than welcome to join us at these celebrations. However, we ask that the Year 3 students please book into one of the nights via trybooking.

Thank you for bringing your child to this moment, ready to experience God's beautiful gift of forgiveness, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, for the first time. The Sacramental Planning Team knows the importance of making this a blessed moment, and hopes that your family's experience is a positive one.


A gold coin donation in either of the St Vincent de Paul boxes at the front or side entrance to the church will help defray costs.

Gospel: Mt 4:1-11

Jesus fasted for forty days and nights.

Jesus was led by the Spirit out into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, after which he was very hungry, and the tempter came and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to turn into loaves.' But he replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'

The devil then took him to the holy city and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said, 'throw yourself down; for scripture says:

He will put you in his angels' charge, and they will support you on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.'

Jesus said to him, 'Scripture also says: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.'

Next, taking him to a very high mountain, the devil showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendour. 'I will give you all these', he said, 'if you fall at my feet and worship me.' Then Jesus replied, 'Be off, Satan! For scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.' Then the devil left him, and angels appeared and looked after him.



Reflection

The story of Jesus' testing in the wilderness is found in all three synoptic gospels so we hear it every year in the course of the three year cycle. This year we hear from Matthew. Mark's account is very brief and matter of fact, but the stories in Matthew and Luke have much in common, as well as distinct emphases of their own. Comparing them carefully is a rewarding exercise.

It's a dramatic episode, vividly played out in a series of exchanges between Jesus and the devil. The narrative sets the scene succinctly and reports the action as it unfolds. The dynamic of the story is fuelled by the jousting between Jesus and the tempter.

The full import of the episode becomes clear in the responses that Jesus gives. He answers each challenge by quoting a verse from the book of Deuteronomy. This suggests that in his own person Jesus is reversing the false choices made by Israel of old on its way through the dessert. He is determined to put his faith in God and to trust God's word. This testing is a far cry from what we are inclined today to call our "temptations"; in effect Jesus is making life and death choices from deep within.
