PMs Humanitarian Refugee

The Prime Minister's announcement that Australia will permanently maintain its annual humanitarian intake is a good start but must not mask the "elephant in the room," the plight of refugees on Manus Island and Nauru, writes Phil Glendenning.

Mr Glendenning, the Director of the Edmund Rice Centre and President of the Refugee Council of Australia, has welcomed Malcolm Turnbull's long

overdue announcement yesterday, including the

resettling of refugees from Central America, an

increase in funding for international refugee programs, and a permanent increase in our humanitarian intake to 18,750.

"These announcements are a good start, but they must only be the first steps in our response to the global refugee crisis," Mr Glendenning said.

"Australia must play its role in building durable solutions for displaced people ground the world—

solutions for displaced people around the world – safe return to countries of origin, integration in host countries, and resettlement.

"Le contries, and resettlement.

"Increasing our humanitarian intake and providing more funding for refugee programs are important steps in building durable solutions, but more can be done.

"A humanitarian intake of 18,750 is still less than the 27,000 that was recommended by the Panel of Experts report handed in by Angus Houston, Paris Aristotle, and Michael l'Estrange in 2012. "A \$130 million increase in funding for international refugee programs is insignificant compared with the \$9.6 billion spent by the government on its offshore detention program since 2013.

In our struggles to be faithful disciples, we frequently must endure periods when we feel abandoned by God. When we have been intent on serving God with genuine devotion, such times are particularly trying, for one would expect that God would not withdraw consolations. When this happens, the broken héart and the strained spirit cry out to God in complaint: How long? Why? We have all been worn down by life, tempted to give up, too weary to go on. Faith in God is a gift for which we pray. It enables us to accomplish marvellous feats; with it we can move mountains. As unprofitable servants, we do not earn it; we have no right to claim it as our own. We are the ones from whom faithful service will be expected. We will be sent to plough the fields and tend the sheep. We will be called to serve at table. The faith that is ours has been mediated to us through the community. We have heard about God and about Jesus from others, from our parents and families, from our teachers and those who preach, from those with whom we work and play. Faith comes from God, but through the mediation of the community. Timothy received faith from his mother and grandmother. It was strengthened in him through the imposition of Paul's hands and through his preaching of the word of God. Furthermore, what Paul taught had first been handed down to him from those who preceded him.
