2014 STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

SPECIAL REQUEST

At this week's Liturgy meeting we discussed the attitude that we bring as we come together as a Christian Community to celebrate the Eucharist. While no-one has the right to judge another person on any particular occasion, it is a fact that generally one-third of people arrive after Mass has started.

If you find that you are regularly late for Mass, perhaps you could plan to set out five minutes earlier.

There are two major parts of the celebration of Mass – the Word and the Eucharist. Both are crucially important. The Lord is equally present in His Word and in His Body and Blood.

Out of respect for the sacredness of God's Word and out of of respect for our fellow worshippers, we suggest that if you find yourself arriving at Mass when the Scripture readings are being proclaimed, that you wait at the back of the church until the reading is finished and then take your seat.

REFLECTION



This feast celebrates the power and authority of Christ by creating a collage of images that capture one or more characteristics of Christ's kingship. Each image reinterprets the concept of king, investing it with new meaning. Gathered together they create a kind of litany that extols the kingship of

Shepherd and commander call to mind the care and protection that Christ lavishes on those who place themselves under his care. King of Israel is a sign of universal rule. Image of the Invisible God acclaims the divine origin of Christ and of the rule that he exercises over all. First born of all Creation places Christ over the entire created world. Source of all Created Things acknowledges

both the sovereignty of Christ and his importance as the model after which all things were fashioned. Head of the Body, the Church underscores the intimacy and interrelationship that exist between Christ and all those who are joined to him through faith and baptism. Firstborn of the Dead not only acclaims Christ's resurrection, but it also guarantees the resurrection of those who will follow him into death. Crucified King is clearly the image that reinterprets all other images.

The entire liturgical year is brought to completion in the last words of the gospel: 'Today you will be with me in Paradise.' These are the words that we all long to hear, words that are empty when coming from one who has no authority, but charged with power when spoken by the one who is king over us all.
