

Collection this weekend

We have a collection this weekend for the 88 retired priests who are supported by the Priests' Retirement Foundation. Seven Melbourne priests retired in the past year and there will be an average of six retirements each year for the next six years. Priests are not employees of the Archbishop or the parish so they are not eligible for superannuation. Like others in the workplace, priests provide for their retirement by contributing 12.5% of the weekly presbytery collection to the Foundation.

Parables of Mercy


