Letter from the Vicar General

The Vicar General Mons. Greg Bennet has written to advise us that with the Royal Commission into the Church's response to abuse beginning an open hearing in Melbourne, that the hearing had already inquired about a priest who was parish priest in Eltham in the 1980's.

The hearing has already examined what occurred in Holy Family parish and school, Doveton and intends to examine the conduct of another six priests, complaints made against them and how those complaints were dealt with by the Archdiocese. The Vicar General advises us that if any parishioners require pastoral advice and support that this is available through Ms Vicki Russell who leads the Pastoral Care Support Team in his office.

If parishioners seek information about the Royal Commission, how to access support and how to report abuse to the Church and Victoria Police, the Vicar General has sent us a one-page flyer with all necessary details – we have them available on the table in the gathering area.
